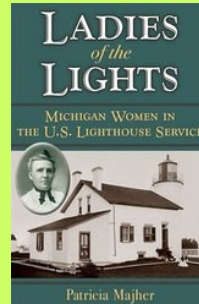

State-wide search at your fingertips!

The State Library of Michigan provides an excellent service: a state-wide catalog called MeLCat. When you search MeLCat, you have access to the holdings of over 400 libraries across the state. If there's an item you need that KJS Library doesn't have and another library loans it, in MeLCat you can request that item and have it delivered to you here at KJS Library. Orders may be filled in as short a time as a few days, but may take up to two weeks. Put the power of MeLCat to work for you!
