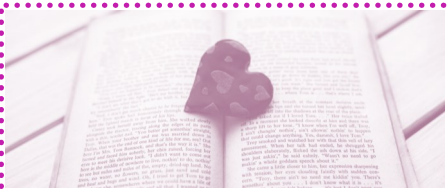

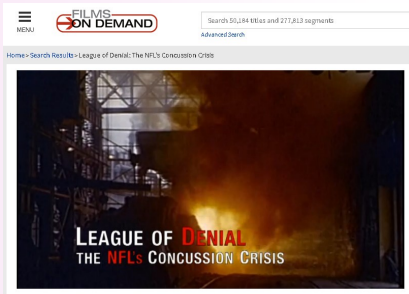
## Calling all library lovers!

## Featured Database: Films on Demand

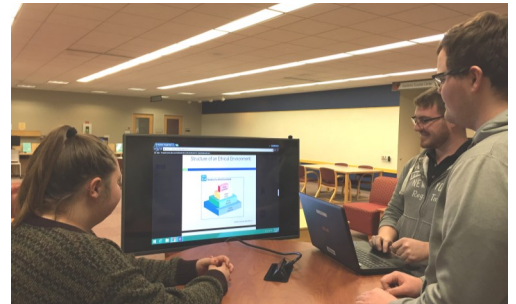

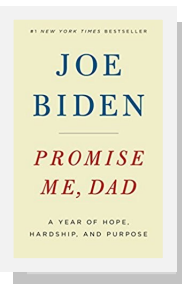
