**Wear Red Day** in honor of Henrietta Lacks who passed away on **Oct 4**, 1951

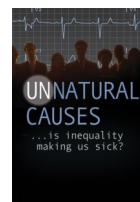
**Community DNA Living Art Project**

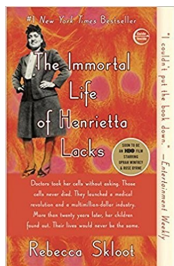

**Outline and rewrite your notes.** Create an outline with your class notes with key words or phrases.

**Use memory games** (mnemonic devices). Create a new phrase or sentence to help you remember.

**Practice by yourself or with friends.** Create practice exams or use flash cards. Have a small group study session.
