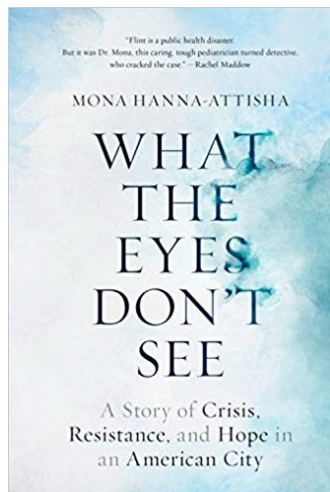

Summer Registration

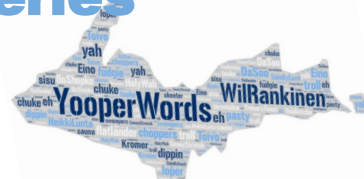
The library will be hosting registration for incoming students on the afternoons of June 20, 22, 24, July 11, 12 and 15.
