Did you know... that you can renew your library books in several different ways to avoid late fees?

- Go to the LSSU online catalog, log into your account, select the books you wish to be renewed, and request renewal.
- Stop by the Circulation Desk (you don't have the book with you) and ask to renew it.
- Call the Circulation Desk at 906-635-2815.
- Use the "Chat with a librarian" chat service on the library's home page to request a renewal.
- Send an email to Reference@lssu.edu or lssulibrary@lssu.edu and include your name, student ID, the name of the book and the barcode on the back inside cover and ask for a renewal.

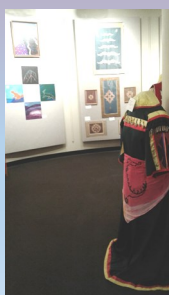


In the Art Gallery

Need help trying to plan a career path in your major? Not sure about what type of work you really want to do?

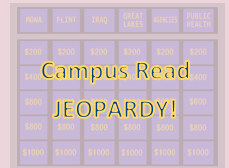
